Overview

Only eight owners in 225 years have had the pleasure and distinction of calling Llangollen home. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places and declared a Virginia Treasure, this property is without peer, and it offers a life like no other.

The Location

Llangollen is located in a vast, picturesque setting at the foot of the Blue Ridge Mountains in Virginia's Shenandoah Valley. Situated three miles north of the village of Upperville in historic Loudoun County, the property is in good company amid other thoroughbred-breeding farms and large country estates. Nestled on Trappe Road, with a mile-long drive to the front door, homeowners enjoy the privacy of this distinguished enclave, a transcendent respite from the everyday world.

In the 1700s, Loudoun County's rich agriculture and its contributions of grain to George Washington's Continental Army earned it the nickname "Breadbasket of the Revolution."

The property's central Virginia location places it near the Maryland and West Virginia borders, the Potomac River, US Route 50 and I-66, and major cities and affluent suburbs.

The Land

Both pristine and functional, inviting and cloistered, Llangollen is 1,100 acres of rolling terrain, including 350 acres of mountain woodland. It has the distinction of being first surveyed by future-Founding Father George Washington in the late 1700s. Since then, a number of dignitaries, movie stars, socialites and noble equines have walked these pastoral acres.

Enjoy the property as a delightful family retreat, filled with outdoor activities and connections with nature. Llangollen is also a working farm, and offers plenty of opportunities and land for cultivation and pleasure.

The Manor House

The main residence of Llangollen is secluded amid 30 acres of manicured lawns, gardens and outbuildings. The manor house exhibits a grand antebellum Federal style, circa 1800, bearing the distinctive architectural features of its time, as well as later Colonial Revival enhancements. A noble portico with classical columns creates a bold impression, while graceful balustrades adorn the length of the flat roof. Interiors balance the decorative sensibilities of then and now. Select furnishings and artifacts will remain with the home to preserve its history.
